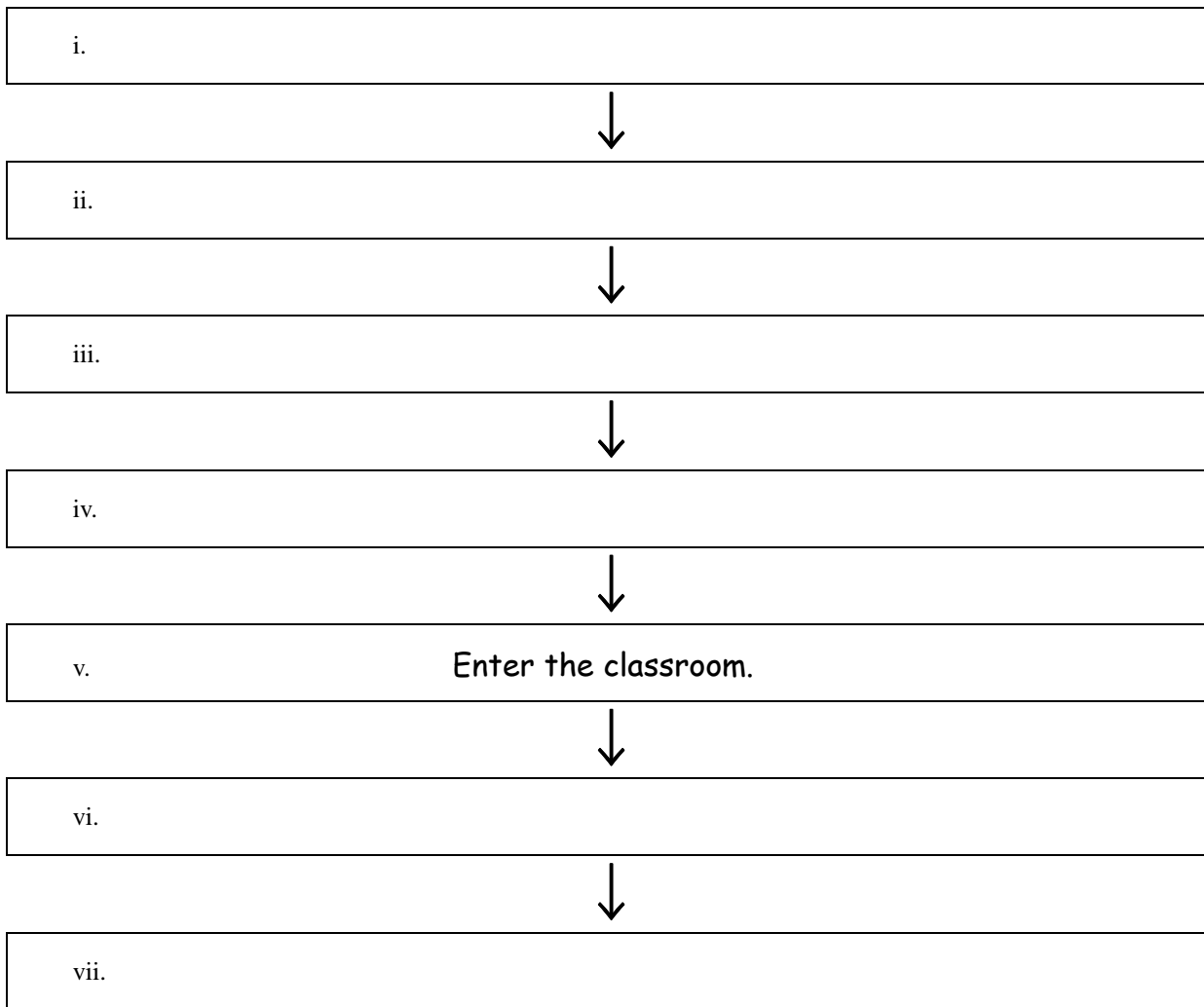

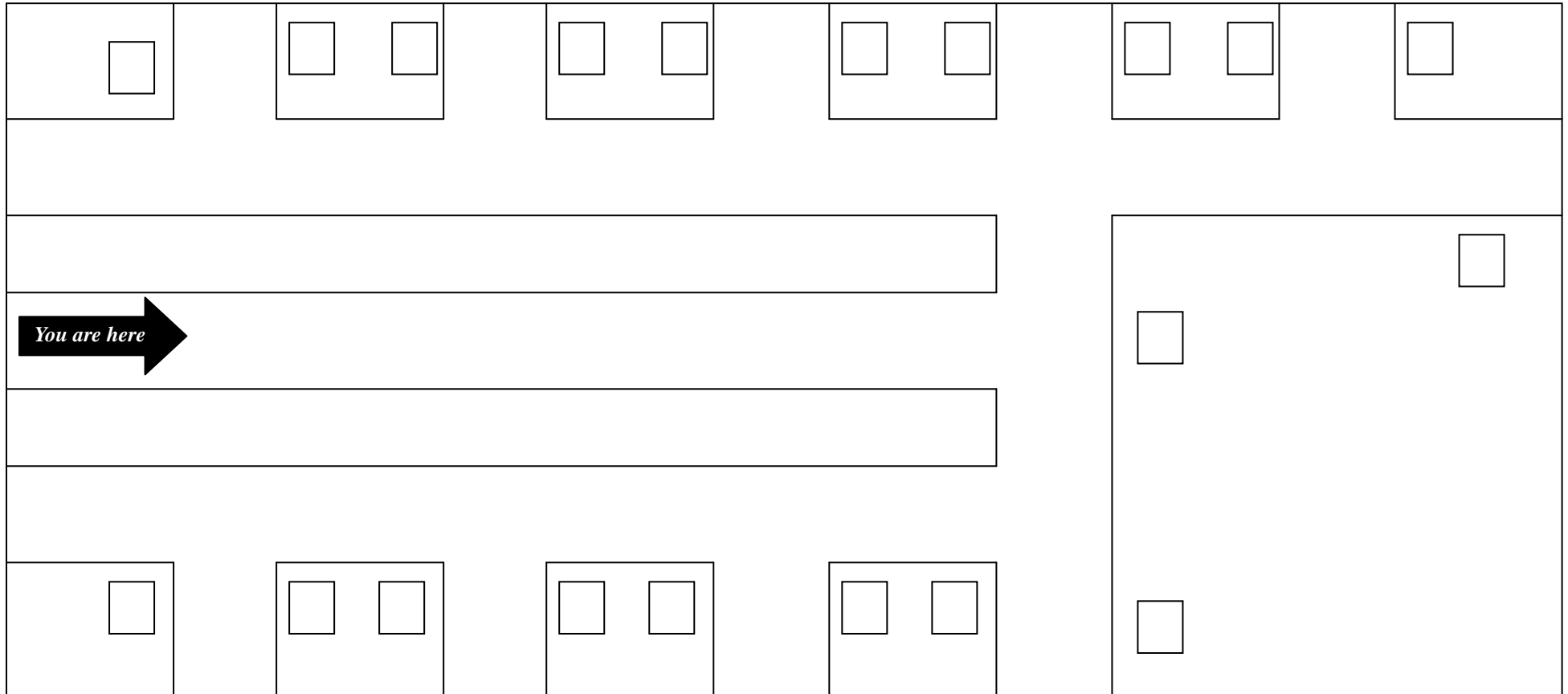

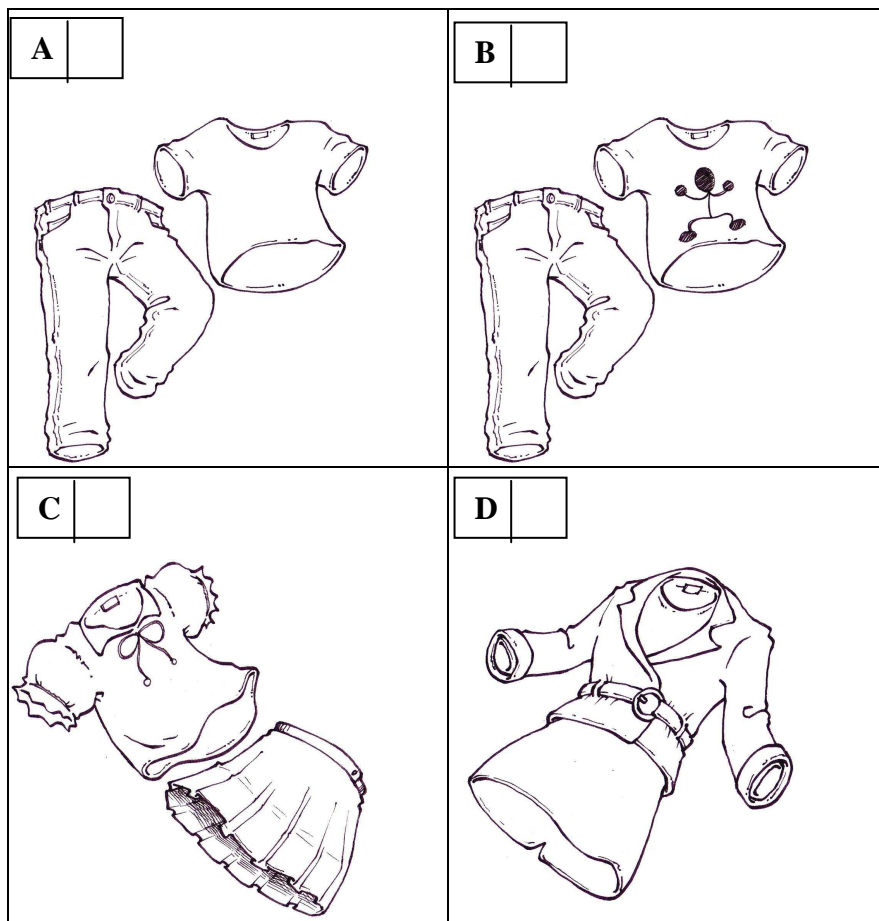

Hiking
